## Extend: Tips & Tricks to Help You With Your Google Search

### 1.) For best results:

- Identify unique words
- Do not use too many words
- Use mostly nouns

## 2.) Methods for creating queries:

- Parsing a question
- Creating a word web or mind map of key words
- List words based on prior knowledge about the topic

## 3.) Additional Tip:

• Imagine the source you might expect to find the information from (medical website, education website, community center, etc.) and figuring out how to look for it
