Course offerings are available in the Spring for the start of the next school year (Semester 1) in the fall and in the late fall/winter for Semester 2. 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<p>Specialist High Skills Majors (SHSM)</p> <p>Interested in the Environmental SHSM or the Information and Communication Technology SHSM? Students are strongly encouraged to complete co-op education in grade 11 and should consider selecting co-op during the course selection cycle.</p>
