

Brook Class Mission Homework – Autumn A 2026

Your target up to half term is to earn a minimum of 100 points by selecting homework tasks from those below. You can choose to do any of these tasks, to meet or exceed the total points.

The focus is quality work (not just completing work). All homework needs to be completed before the end of the half-term. Think carefully about the presentation and content of your work to make sure you give your best to produce work to be proud of.

Geography How do you get to school? Think about your journey to school. What do you see? Do you pass any landmarks? (shops, buildings, parks) Can you draw a map of your route to school? Don't forget to label any landmarks and label the roads you pass.  30 marks	PSHE This term in PSHE we will be thinking about our feelings and emotions and how we can manage them in different situations. What makes you feel happy, sad, worried, excited or angry? Can you create an “All About My Feelings” wheel like the one below? In the middle, write “My Feelings” and in each section, draw or write about a different feeling. You could include when you feel this way and what helps you to feel better.  30 marks	Science Animals including humans Research and create a poster about your favourite animal. Don't forget to include the following facts: • The group which the animal belongs to. • Where the animal lives. • What the animal likes to eat and if it is an omnivore, carnivore or herbivore. • The features that the animal has to help it survive. You could also include some other interesting facts about your animal.  30 marks
Geography What would you like to see in your local area? Think about Hollinwood and what facilities it has to offer. Can you think of something that maybe Hollinwood hasn't got and you would love to have eg: ice skating rink, bowling alley etc. Would it be a type of human or physical geography? Imagine you had £1million pounds to spend on improving your area. What would you plan to build and why? You could present this as a poster or even in a letter asking our local council to help us. 30 marks	Religious Education Find out about the story of Jonah. Either produce a storyboard or draw a picture representing the story and write what Christians might learn about what God is like from the story of Jonah. 30 marks 	Science Animals including humans - All animals and humans as they grow change. What can you do now that you couldn't do when you were 1 years old? What do you think you will be able to do in three years time that you can't do now? Make a timeline of your life from when you were born to now. Don't forget to include pictures and information about how you have changed. At the end think of one thing you want to achieve that you haven't yet. 30 marks
Geography Physical and Human landmarks. Physical landmarks are those things that occur naturally in a place eg: rivers, fields, hills, streams, woodland. We have lots of beautiful physical landmarks close by like Daisy Nook, Saddleworth moors, Castleshaw.
