This Week at Folsom

This week was physically fun for students as we held our much delayed Ski & Ride Trip to Smugglers Notch on Monday, and the 3rd and 4th graders went skating on the Essex High rink as a team-building activity. Many students said it was their first time ice skating.





The 7th and 8th grade students wrapped up their study of the nervous system by exploring the human eye. They learned how the eye captures images and how the brain processes them. They discussed how rods allow us to see in black and white, while cones enable color vision. Through experiments with lenses and light sources, students also discovered why some eyes require corrective lenses. To conclude the study, Ms. Cantell and students dissected a cow eye. Students were excited to observe how the iris functions, the apparent "absence" of a pupil, and the tangible structure of the lens.

Measles

GISU Nurse Kristie Barber shares this information about measles: As of March 11, 2025, there has been one case of measles in Vermont in 2025. Stay up to date at HealthVermont.gov/measles. According to 2023-2024 school immunization survey data, 93% of children in Vermont public and independent schools are fully vaccinated against measles before entering kindergarten. This data does not include children who are home schooled or not yet enrolled in school. Because measles is so contagious, 95% of a population needs to be immune to limit the spread of the virus effectively.

State Testing

Each year, students across Vermont take state tests in English Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics, and Science. At Grand Isle Supervisory Union, students in grades 3-8 participate. These assessments are called the Vermont Comprehensive Assessment Program (VTCAP). This is the third year we have been using this test in the state. The tests are taken on computers and have many options to support student needs. The tests will be given between March 10 and May 2, 2025. Tests will be given at any time during the testing window and will be held at school during the regular school day. Our school's schedule is below:

Please make sure your student has a good night's sleep and eats a nutritious breakfast before testing. We also encourage students to bring wired headphones from home if they have a pair that is most comfortable for them.

We will send home your child's student report once we receive it. State assessments are just one way that we measure student learning. It is important to remember that the VTCAP measures broad areas of understanding while our local assessments are more specific to what students are learning in the moment. If you have questions, please reach out to the school.
