#### 1. \_\_\_\_ GENERAL ACTIVITY AGREEMENT:

The OWL program is a 3-day long extracurricular outdoor science laboratory experience sponsored jointly by Mesa County Valley School District No. 51 ("District") and Colorado Parks and Wildlife ("CPW"). It takes students out of the traditional classroom to "learn by doing" in the outdoors, away from the distractions of their everyday activities. Students participating in the program will be transported by school bus to the OWL program site near Gateway, Colorado, where they will engage in experiential learning activities designed to apply standards-based, District-approved curriculum to real-world settings and situations, and to develop their critical thinking, problem-solving and other skills as well their connection with and respect for the environment. All OWL activities will be led and supervised by an interdisciplinary team of District teachers and counselors, CPW officers, and other professionals. In

addition, students will have an opportunity to participate in hiking, camping, archery and various other outdoor recreational and team-building activities. If you have questions regarding the meaning or legal effect of this form, please consult legal counsel before completing or submitting this form.

So that you and your child are fully aware of the risks, terms and conditions that apply to participation in the OWL program, please read the following carefully with your child:

Your child is not required to participate in the OWL program, and such participation is completely voluntary. Your electronic signature written permission and release of liability at the end of this registration page is required for your student to participate.

Although there are trained persons in charge, participation in the OWL program involves certain dangers and risks (such as those listed below) that are inherent in outdoor education/recreation, and the District does not guarantee accident-free participation. These risks include, but are not limited to: hiking, rock climbing, biking, motor vehicle accidents, adverse weather, sun exposure, moving water, slippery rocks, uneven ground, wild animals, equipment malfunctions or misuse, poisonous plants, venomous snakes, and bites and stings from bees, wasps and scorpions. Prudent safety measures will be taken to provide protection against these risks, but your child is responsible for following the instructions and safety rules supplied by OWL program staff. Nevertheless, participation in OWL program activities entails some risk of serious personal injury, property damage and even death. We encourage you to inquire in advance concerning the nature and details of each activity and of any potential risks that will be assumed by participants. By signing below, you acknowledge that you have made yourself and your child aware of any potential risks regarding such participation, and that you and your child voluntarily and knowingly assume all such risks.

The District does not have any medical/dental/hospitalization insurance covering students for illnesses or injuries incurred while participating in the OWL program. If your child does not already have health/medical insurance coverage, you should investigate and obtain adequate health/medical insurance coverage for your child.

Any student who fails to abide by District's Code of Student Conduct (Policy JICDA), the OWL Behavior Rules (including the OWL Code), the OWL Dress Code/Borrowed Items Guidelines or OWL program staff instructions during participation in the OWL program may be subject to immediate removal from the program. If your child is removed from participation for disciplinary reasons, you may be required to travel to Gateway to pick up your student immediately.

The District reserves the right to cancel any OWL program session or activity, for a single participant, a number of participants or the entire group, at any time it believes such action is necessary to protect the health or safety any student(s) and/or staff member(s) or for other good cause. The District shall not be liable for any loss or damage caused by or in any way attributable to such cancellation decision. The District may, in its sole discretion, attempt to reschedule an OWL session that is canceled, but shall not have any obligation to do so.

I acknowledge that I am the parent/legal guardian of my child; that I have carefully read the foregoing disclosure regarding the terms, conditions and risks of participation in the OWL program; that I and my child know of the risks involved in participation in the OWL program and understand the serious injury, and even death, is possible with such participation; that I voluntarily choose to accept any and all responsibility for my child's safety and welfare while participating in the OWL program; and that I knowingly and voluntarily—Give my permission for my child to participate in the OWL program located in Gateway, Colorado.



#### 2. BEHAVIOR AGREEMENT:

I have discussed OWL's Behavior Expectations with my student and he/she and I AGREE to accept responsibility for their behavior while at OWL. (Pop up window with below content)

Core Beliefs of Student Behavior: We believe that students can or learn to...be responsible for themselves,make decisions and live with the consequences of those decisions, own and solve problems, acknowledge the feelings of others, as well as their own feelings, see problems as opportunities,work to their potential, and persevere.

OWL Staff Commitment to Supporting Student Behavior:

OWL Staff will work to guide students through the decision-making process to assist him/her in seeking positive solutions. OWL is committed to work with all MCVSD 51 staff, counselors, and volunteers to ensure the consistency of this positive approach to discipline and problem solving. However, students who make decisions that endanger the health and safety of themselves or others and those who demonstrate a lack of respect, will incur consequences for their behavior. Consequences will be based on the severity of the behavior and might include but are not limited to: redirection to appropriate problem-solving/dispute resolution methods, missing a class or activity or taking a break, restorative practice, call home, sent home from OWL (note: parent/guardian will be required to pick up the student). Finally, the policies and regulations contained in District 51's Attendance, Conduct, and Discipline Code are applicable to students in the OWL program. Further consequences may be imposed by the home school for serious violations of the Code. In other words, if it applies at your middle school, it applies at OWL.

Acknowledgements: I acknowledge that this agreement is to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all students who desire to learn from this outdoor education opportunity.

I acknowledge that I have read the Behavior Expectations and the OWL CODE with my student. I understand that he/she will be responsible for meeting the behavioral standards of OWL, including a commitment to working with adult staff to solve his/her own problems during the Outdoor Wilderness Lab. I have also previously received and read the District 51's Attendance, Conduct, and Discipline Code, as part of the district's Parent Student Handbook, and understand that the Code also applies during the time of this experience. Additionally, I understand that, if my student needs to leave OWL during the week, it is my responsibility to provide the necessary transportation.

#### 3. Dress Code/ Borrowed Items

I AGREE to the OWL Dress Code Policy/ Packing List (pop up with content below):

General Guidelines: We encourage students to pack their own gear so that they know what they have. Layering of clothing is recommended. Changes in the weather mean frequent changes of clothing. Weather will not impede activities if your student is prepared! Borrow clothing or equipment you may not have- Parents, if at all possible, do not buy clothing and equipment for the OWL school. Utilize what you already have. Items on the list indicated by an asterisk \* may be borrowed from OWL on the "acknowledgements" form. Pack waterproof items as much as possible- It is preferred that you waterproof your student's clothing and hiking boots to ensure dryness in all weather conditions. Pack to protect from the sun- Hats, sunglasses, sunscreen are highly encouraged. High intensity light from bright sun and winter glare off snow, even on cloudy days, can cause injury. All items should be clearly marked with the student's first and last name. Students are responsible for their own belongings. We will keep all items left behind for 1 WEEK immediately following OWL, then donate the remaining items to charity. ITEMS NOT TO BRING: food, unauthorized medications, radios, iPods, MP3 players, cell phones, 2-way radios, electronic games, gum, knives, any toiletries in a spray (aerosol) or pump bottle, hair dryers, curling irons, and clothing that does not cover all undergarments, midriffs, lower backs, cleavage, have straps less than 1" wide, are "off the shoulders" or halters. \*Please note: A hooded sweatshirt is NOT considered a coat, Outdoor shoes must be sturdy and must fully cover feet, Long pants are required, shorts are optional. \*Outdoor Wilderness Lab is not responsible for broken, lost, or stolen items. Borrowing Items: I agree that I may borrow items if needed, but will return them in the same or similar quality as I borrowed them.
