# Unit 4: God's Chosen People and the New Covenant

Stage 1: Desired Results	
<ul> <li>This unit is a study of how the Old Testament prophesies are lived out.</li> <li>We focus on the life of Christ and the beginning of His Church.</li> <li>Reminder: Unit 1 continues throughout weeks 3-37. Refer to Unit 1 throughout the school year to celebrate feasts, holy days of obligations, saints, solemnities, and Seasons of the Church (i.e. Advent, Lent). Students should be aware of the liturgical life of the Church as we live our faith.</li> </ul>	How do we live out the mission of the Church in our communities and the world at large?     What does God teach us in the New Covenant and how do we apply that in our lives?

# Sacred Scripture

#### **Sacraments**

Standard 3: SACRAMENTS: Understand and participate in the sacraments of the Church as efficacious signs of God's grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church.

- 6.03.01 Describe the sacraments and their visible rites as efficacious signs and instruments of grace given by Christ to the Church.
- 6.03.02 Describe each of the seven sacraments as entrusted to the Church.
- 6.03.03 Describe that the sacraments accompany a person from life to death and impart God's life to us.
- 6.03.04 State the sacraments that have an indelible character and describe elements of this character.
- 6.03.05 Recognize baptism is "necessary for salvation for those to whom the Gospel has been proclaimed" and those that had the possibility of asking for the sacrament.
- 6.03.06 Distinguish between the actions of the penitent and the priest's absolution during the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation.
- 6.03.07 Define repentance, confession, reparation, examination of conscience, penance and reconciliation.

#### Catholic Church

Standard 8: CATHOLIC CHURCH: Understand and appreciate the mystery of the Church, the Body of Christ, the community of believers, as expressed in the Church's origin, mission of evangelization, hierarchical structure, marks, charisms, members and the communion of saints.

- 6.08.01 Explain that the mission of Christ and the Holy Spirit is brought to completion in the Church which is the Body of Christ.
- 6.08.02 Understand that the Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, continues Christ's saving work, especially through the Sacraments.
- 6.08.03 Discuss the Church's visible bonds of unity: one origin, one baptism and an unbroken line of apostolic succession beginning with Peter.
- 6.08.04 Describe the Pope as the leader of the Catholic Church throughout the world.
- 6.08.05 Relate that the church is a community of God's people called to continual reform and renewal.
- 6.08.06 Describe the Magisterium as the teaching office of the bishops in communion with the Pope.
- 6.08.08 Define the "Communion of Saints," and its significance to our lives and the life of the Church.

# Ecumenism & Inter-religious Dialogue

Standard 11: ECUMENISM AND INTER-RELIGIOUS DIALOUGUE: Understand and participate in the call of the Church to be a sign of unity in the world through knowledge of and collaboration with Christian churches and all faith traditions.

- 6.11.01 Define the meaning of "ecumenism" and illustrate how it relates to others.
- 6.11.02 Explain that the Pope is the successor of the Apostle Peter and thus the leader of the Roman Catholic Church and a sign of our unity.
- 6.11.03 Examine how our friendship with other Christians means that we can both recognize what we share in common but also be honest about how we differ.
- 6.11.04 Identify where in the New Testament that Jesus prayed "that they all may be one" (John 17:20-21).

- 6.11.05 Research how Eastern Catholic Churches are in union with the Roman Catholic Church and describe their liturgy sacraments, prayer, and church laws.
- 6.11.06 Define interreligious dialogue and compare and contrast it to ecumenism.

# Mission
