TIME: 5 -7 min	Learning Experiences & Instruction: ENGAGE: What is a responsibility? any ideas? The definition is: having a duty to deal with something Being accountable for something having a moral obligation to behave a certain way a thing which one is required to do as part of a job, or role White boards out please! using white board, answer the following questions: What responsibilities do you have at home? What responsibilities do you have at school? What responsibilities do you have in the community? What is an example of a responsible action? White boards away I am going to hand out a sheet for you to keep a diary of your responsible actions from now until monday, whoever brings this sheet (filled out) back to me on monday gets to pick a treat. (I will hand these out at the end of class)
10 min instructions	What about a right? Does anyone have any ideas of what a right is? A right is something that a person is legally entitled to. Something that they need, not something that they want. We are going to do activity, on these cards are needs and wants. there are 20 labeled cards and 4 blank ones As groups you will come up with 4 additional wants or needs. Then I am going to drop off 4 dice for you, what ever the number you roll is the number that you get to keep. I will pass out 7 poster sheets for you to glue your question sheet in the middle, and then as a group you will make your decisions and glue the ones you are keeping to the top of the poster. Before we start lets go over the questions on the question sheet so I can give you examples of how to answer. While I pass your materials out, you can get your glue sticks out. activity time When done, discuss how many items each group had to eliminate, were similar ones eliminated first? Do all people have the same things? Do some people have more needs and wants in there lives than others? reminder to hand out sheets
