About This Guide

Susan J. Ellis (1946–2019) was one of the most influential thinkers in the field of volunteer engagement. As founder of Energize, Inc. and a prolific author and speaker, she wrote a monthly Hot Topics essay from 1997 until shortly before her death in 2019, building an archive of nearly 270 articles that remain essential reading for anyone serious about the profession.

This guide organises those articles into 20 themes to help volunteer engagement professionals — wherever they are in the world — quickly find the essays most relevant to their current priorities, challenges, and questions. Each article title is a clickable hyperlink that will take you directly to the original text on the Energize website.
