

4. **Save** when you are done.

5. **Export to PDF** and turn in your Lyric Lab rhyme to Google Classroom.

**After you finish your poem–**


4. Write at least two supportive, academic comments to your classmates. You must write a comment for the person in front of you and the person behind you.
