Deadline to apply: February 18, 2022 3:00 pm CT or when 700 applications have been received

Wells Fargo has developed this scholarship program to help people with disabilities obtain their education or training necessary to succeed in the career path of their choice.

- Have an identified disability (defined as someone who has, or considers themselves to have, a long-term or recurring issue that impacts one or more major life activity)
- Have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent
- Be a high school senior or graduate who plans to enroll or who is already enrolled in full-time or half-time (at least 6 credits per term) undergraduate study at an accredited two-year or four-year college or university in the United States for the entire 2022-2023 academic year

Maude and Alexander Hadden Scholarship

Deadline: February 28, 2022

The Maude and Alexander Hadden Scholarship is open to high school seniors seeking higher education at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States. The scholarship committee will consider character, financial need, scholastic achievement (at least a 3.5 GPA), objectives, volunteerism, potential for leadership and good citizenship. Awards of up to \$4,000 will be provided.

Explore Solar System and Beyond: Comets

Event Date: Feb. 14 at 6 p.m. EST

Comets are ancient members of the solar system that have fascinated people for thousands of years. Learn about the high-tech NASA missions giving us new information about comets. Explore NASA STEM activities to engage students, plus gain access to instructional slideshows, videos, and links to even more standards-aligned resources ready to use in the classroom or at home.

Aeronaut-X: X-Plane Glider Design Challenge

Event Date: Feb. 15 at 5 p.m. EST

Get an overview of the X-glider Design Challenge, where students apply the engineering design process to create X-plane gliders. Participants will review the history of X-planes and NASA aeronautical research, and learn about the future of NASA aeronautics innovation. For decades

NASA has been studying aircraft noise to reduce noise emissions. Learn about NASA's newest X-plane, the X-59 Quiet SuperSonic Technology (QueSST) and NASA's research on quiet supersonic flight.

Explore Earth - Real NASA Data for Real Learning with MyNASAData

Event Date: Feb. 15 at 7 p.m. EST

Join us for an overview of resources from the My NASA Data website. These resources use authentic data to explore topics ranging from climate system interactions to ocean ecology to forest fires. Use of the Live Access Server for data analysis will also be discussed. This webinar addresses the Next Generation Science Standards ESS2 and ESS3.

Methods of Motivation: Ideas to Consider when Helping to Motivate Children Feb 16, 2022 12:00 PM in Pacific Time (US and Canada)

This webinar provides insight into how parents and teachers can help motivate children to start a task, complete a task, and persist with a task when encountering obstacles. Special focus will be given to understanding why children might vary in their levels of motivation.

NASA STEM - Explore Earth Systems: The Importance of Water
