## Tips for Creating a Teachable Lesson.....

- 1. Have an OBJECTIVE. In other words, write down the word "Objective" and then tell your audience what your goals are for this lesson. What do you want them to learn/understand by the conclusion of the lesson? What do you want them to get out of this lesson? Having a well-thought out objective is the very first step of a successful lesson.
- 2. Link to "Big Ideas". What are the most important concepts for the unit you want to teach?

\*\*Here are some questions to ask yourself when determining Big Ideas and how you want to cover them:

- Why is this important?
- How can it relate to me, the teacher, and to them, the audience? Come up with examples
- What is the real-world value of this topic?
- What are the major concepts involved in this topic?
- 3. Have a visual to demonstrate your topic. This will appeal to visual learners and will enhance understanding of the material
- 4. Give an assignment that stimulates the audience to think about the topic. Make it an assignment that involves research on their part. It doesn't have to be "in-depth" research (unless you design it that way), but make it an assignment that's relative to your topic. An assignment someone can benefit from with questions that make them think
