



Inter-American Development Bank – Rutgers University Call for Research Proposals to contribute to the construction of a:

Comprehensive Penitentiary Management Model for Health and Humanitarian Crises Response in Latin America and the Caribbean Prisons as a Regional Public Good

Who can submit proposals?

This call is open to natural persons, nationals of <u>IDB member countries</u>, individual researchers or part of research groups affiliated with government institutions or civil society entities (universities, NGOs, think tanks, etc.) (the "Researchers" and individually, the "Researcher"). Researchers are required to have at least an accredited specialization or master's degree, and at least two years of work in institutional management or social research accredited through publications or institutional certifications.

What should the proposal include?

Local context and specific research objectives. The proposal must specify the local context of the country or countries under study, the specific topic on which the research will focus, as well as the main research questions.

Review of relevant academic and institutional literature. The proposal must specify the knowledge gaps it intends to address, as well as the way in which the study is contributing to closing the knowledge gaps.

Methodology for the analysis of IDB surveys. Research proposals must explicitly develop the following aspects as part of their analysis plan without prejudice to what the investigator(s) consider pertinent:

Link to Annex 1. Database variables and observations

- i. Statistically characterize the prison population in sociodemographic terms in a country/group of countries according to the data from the IDB surveys that are part of this call, or more up-to-date relevant data if available.
- ii. Link this descriptive analysis with the academic/institutional literature with a view to specifying a specific prison management problem or an opportunity for intervention.
- iii. Identify how these analyzes and their corresponding results make a valuable contribution to the available literature about the project.
- iv. Specify the use of information sources for this research. The use of microdata from prison surveys financed by the IDB will be privileged for the selection of Researchers.
- v. Propose public policy recommendations to improve the prison management challenge or to develop the proposed intervention.

Identification of other primary or secondary sources. Researchers applying are expected to:

- i. Combine information from the analysis of IDB surveys and other primary or secondary information sources to concretely describe a specific prison policy challenge through the characterization of its target population and institutional context; and/or,
- ii. Use IDB surveys and other primary or secondary sources of information to project new intervention programs or service provision inside or outside prisons.





Work plan. The research proposals must include a work plan that has a list of the activities planned for the implementation of the proposed research.

Timeline. Research proposals must include a timeline indicating the activities to be carried out in the context of the research work plan. The investigation must be completed in a maximum of 2.5 months.

Dates. Proposals and all attached documents must be sent in the same file to the email: barbarace@iadb.org. The reception of proposals will be open until May 24, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. (EST time).
