## CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 01/01/2026 and 31/01/2026.

North Queensferry – There were 4 crimes recorded during this period. This includes a vandalism, communication offence and driving offences.

Inverkeithing – There were 36 crimes recorded during this period. This includes crimes of dishonesty, crimes of violence and road traffic offences.

Dalgety Bay/Hillend – There were 11 crimes recorded during this period. Some of the offences include theft by shoplifting, theft of motor vehicle and crimes of violence.

Aberdour – There was 1 crime reported for this period which relates to a theft by shoplifting.

Reviewing the crimes for this month there does not appear to be any crime reports impacting on the wider community.

### **CALLS TO POLICE**

Dates: 01/01/2026 to 31/01/2026

45 calls relate to North Queensferry. The vast majority relate to the motorway network or FRB.

146 calls relate to the Inverkeithing area.

31 calls relate to the Aberdour area.

60 calls relate to the Dalgety Bay/Hillend area.

Remainder of the calls were miscellaneous matters / information only

## COMMUNITY WARD UPDATE

The new Policing for our Communities model will officially go live from the week commencing 24 February 2026. This represents a significant step forward in how we deliver local policing – we will be more visible, more connected, and more responsive to the needs of the communities we serve.

As part of this model, we want to improve the way in which we communicate with members of the public. One way we do this will be by using the NEIGHBOURHOOD ALERT system. This system has been used throughout the UK and allows officers to send real time alerts, safety advice and securely communicate with members of the public. We encourage members of the public to sign up on the Neighbourhood alert website.

Throughout the month, community officers have been conducting anti-social behaviour patrols at the weekends. This allows officers the chance to positively engage with younger members of society whilst ensuring ASB related incidents are kept to a minimum.
