Which ones are important for writing a good recount? Answer: All of them!

- My writing is written for an audience
- My recount has all the parts of the 'hamburger'
- I can write in paragraphs (miss 3 lines before writing a new paragraph)
- It is all in the correct order (title, hook & introduction, event 1,2, 3 and conclusion)
- My recount is written from MY point of view
- I've written about the correct topic
- All my sentences start with different words (for example: first, after that, next, when, lastly)
- I have used interesting vocabulary and the word groups
- All my spelling is correct
- Every sentence has a full stop at the end of the idea.
- Capitals letter are at the beginning of each sentence and when it is a name
- I have used a question mark? at the end of a question
- Exclamation marks are used when you really, really mean it!
- Miss Walters says "you have to use speech marks when someone is talking in your story".
- Commas are used when you are making a list (for example: Rooms 12, 11, 10 and 9 are all doing cross country training together)
- Apostrophes are used for conjunction words (for example: doesn't, can't, shouldn't)
- Has a range of sentences (simple, complex and compound)
- Maintains the correct tense throughout
- Can edit (check) your own writing to make sure it makes sense can find and mix up mistakes
- Your writing makes sense and can be easily read
- Can use a dictionary and thesaurus
