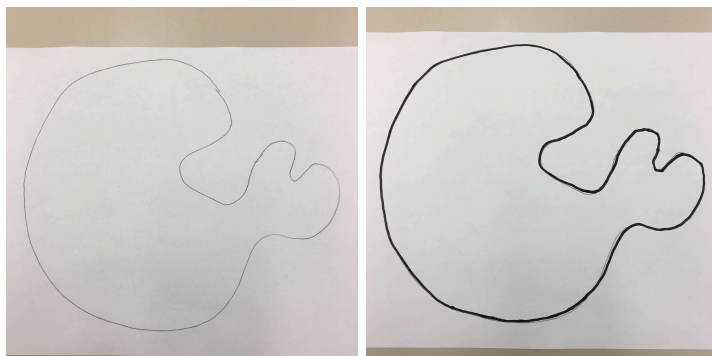


# Make a Plush Monster



On the sewing machine sew together your rectangular and square pieces to make two patchwork pieces that fit generously in your box outline (see the [box instructions](#) for the box outline drawing).

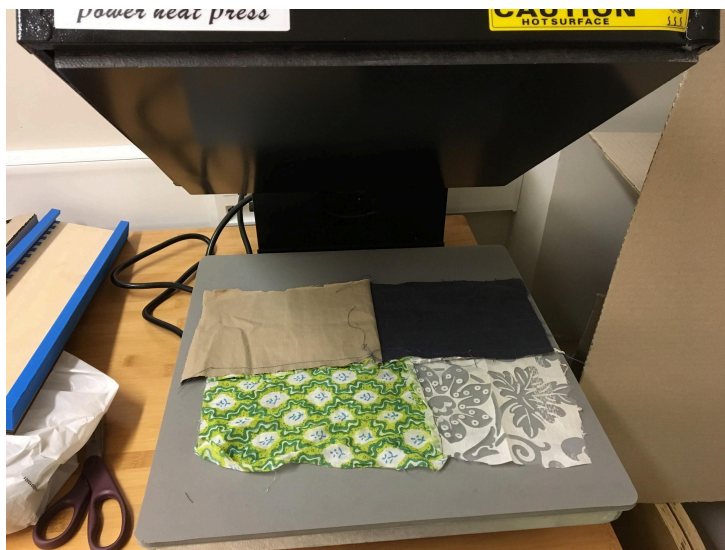
Don't worry about doing a messy job. Look, I put one of my seams on the wrong side!



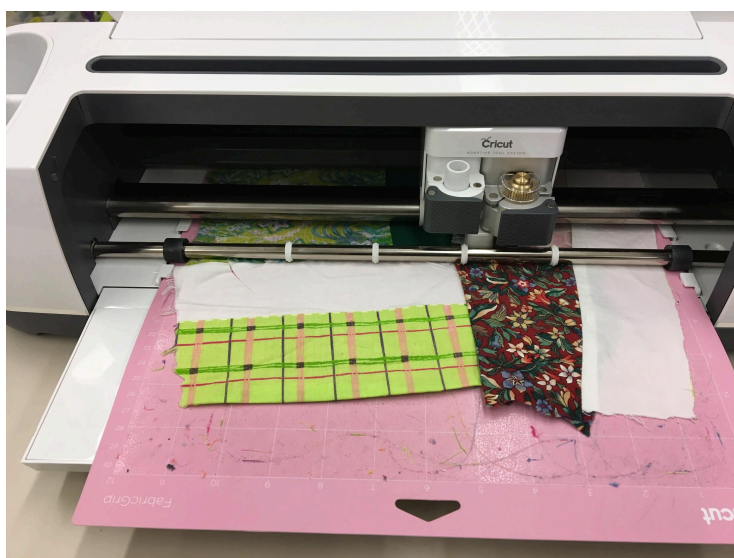
Draw the outline for your Monster, first with pencil, then trace over with Sharpie once you have the shape you want.

Be generous with the size of any limbs! Some width will be lost in the seam and if a limb is too narrow it will be hard to turn right side out and stuff.

Let Mr. Nauman know when your drawing is done. He will take a picture of your outline and prepare it for the Cricut, the machine that will cut your two monster pieces.



Bring your patchwork squares to the heat press and spread them flat if they both fit, or just one if they don't. NOTE: THE TOP PLATE IS HOT. The bottom pad is not. Press the handle down to close. When the timer beeps you can lift the handle and remove your flattened fabric.



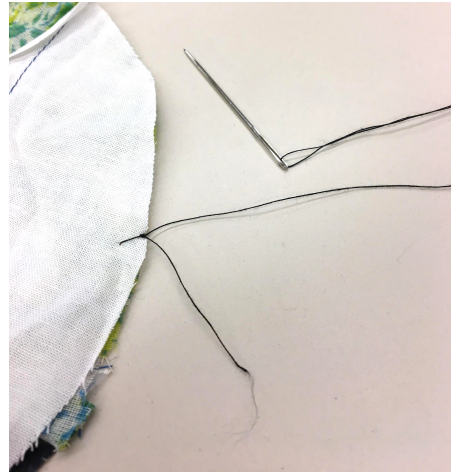
Bring your flattened patches to Mr. Nauman. He will cut them out for you on the Cricut.





Place your two pieces right side in, seams out. Thread a needle with whatever color thread you like.

Poke the needle through where you want to start sewing, pull it almost through, and tie the end off in a knot.



Sew an in-and-out stitch ALMOST all the way around your monster. Stop about 2 inches shy of where you started. Tie off the end by poking through once more and looping through the thread 3 or 4 times, pulling it nice and tight before you snip the end.



Turn your monster right side out and stuff it!



When it's good and stuffed bring the seams together where the hole is, making sure to fold the edges in. Sew the hole together.

# Wow you're done! Raar!

Now time for circuitry!
