The survey results provide foundation for recommendations to relevant stakeholders to assist Vietnamese businesses in improving corporate compliance, business integrity and transparency towards sustainable development. The assessment employed a combination of methods, which are desk study, quantitative study (business survey) and qualitative study (in-depth interviews). 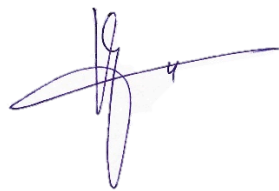

In order to achieve the project objective and to be more understand SMEs for better interventions with SMEs, the project carry out a deep assessment with SMEs with a focus on but not limited to children’s rights issues in the workplace. Launched in February 2007, it aims to improve labour standards and competitiveness in the global garment supply chain by assessing workplace conditions, and advising and training factories through a process of continuous improvement with a goal of improving the lives of workers in 8 countries including Bangladesh, Cambodia, Indonesia, Jordan, Lethoso, Nicaragua, Haiti and Vietnam.
