From a kindergarten assistant at Balfour Elementary School in 1990 to the principal of Hendersonville Elementary School in 2024, my career with HCPS has been marked by dynamic schools, inspiring leaders, creative and caring colleagues, supportive parents, and remarkable students.

I knew I wanted to be a teacher in first grade when I took over my teacher's chair at the horseshoe table. She had stepped away to speak with a student, and I picked up where she left off, continuing the reading lesson. I am not sure how long she watched me, but when I looked up and saw her smiling down at me with approval, I was hooked. As I progressed through our school system as a student, many teachers influenced and encouraged me to become an educator.
