Kids at Grace

By the entrance into the sanctuary, busy bags are available for children to use. During the 10:15 service, before the sermon, Ms. Coli will take children (3 and older) to the other building for an engaging lesson about our hope in Jesus. Children are returned to their families right after the prayers. There is also a quiet room outside the sanctuary with toys and the live stream, if families need a place for younger children throughout the service.

Holy Communion

This meal is weird and wonderful: weird because we actually believe that the bread and wine are the Body and Blood of Jesus the Christ; wonderful because Jesus is with us. We take this meal very seriously here at Grace. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out and allow us to answer your questions. **Children** who have not been instructed in the meaning of the Sacrament may come to the Lord's Table with their parents for a blessing but are asked to fold their arms across their chests to indicate they are to receive a blessing.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE COMMUNION: After the closing hymn, Pastor will pronounce the sending and then for those who wish to share in the celebration of communion shall remain. ***For those who have an intolerance to wine, grape juice is lighter colored on the tray, center.*** Those who find it difficult to walk to the altar can be communed at your seat. Please inform the usher of your need. After the Pastor has given your group the blessing at the altar, you may place your cup in the basket and depart from the Sanctuary down the center aisle, and enjoy fellowship in the hall.

THE SECOND LESSON

Philippians 3:1-9

Paul considers his impressive religious past worthless to gain the surpassing value of knowing Christ.

Further, my brothers and sisters, rejoice in the Lord! It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a safeguard for you. Watch out for those dogs, those evildoers, those mutilators of the flesh. For it is we who are the circumcision, we who serve God by his Spirit, who boast in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh—though I myself have reasons for such confidence.

If someone else thinks they have reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe

of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless.

But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith.

Moved by a Greek woman's humble yet faithful reply, Jesus heals her daughter.

Jesus left that place and went to the vicinity of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know it; yet he could not keep his presence secret. In fact, as soon as she heard about him, a woman whose little daughter was possessed by an impure spirit came and fell at his feet. The woman was a Greek, born in Syrian Phoenicia. She begged Jesus to drive the demon out of her daughter.

“First let the children eat all they want,” he told her, “for it is not right to take the children’s bread and toss it to the dogs.”

“Lord,” she replied, “even the dogs under the table eat the children’s crumbs.”

Then he told her, “For such a reply, you may go; the demon has left your daughter.”

Cris's weekly input: Sermon Summary: Main Idea, Key Points, and Questions:

Did He Call Her a Dog: Mark 7:27

Pastor Cris's Summary:

This sermon explores a difficult saying of Jesus from Mark 7, where he seems to insult a Syrophenician woman by calling her a "dog." The speaker first provides context by examining the religious leaders' obsession with their own traditions and purity, which they used to create a clear divide between "insiders" (themselves) and "outsiders." Jesus condemns this behavior, stating that sin from the heart is what truly defiles a person.

He then turns to the challenging encounter with the Gentile woman. By calling her a "dog," Jesus initially appears to be doing the very thing he just condemned the Pharisees for: making her an outsider. However, the woman's response brilliantly flips the script. Recognizing her status as an outsider, she says, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Her profound faith reveals that even the "crumbs" of Jesus' grace are more than enough.

The sermon highlights this theme of "crumbs" by connecting it to the two feeding miracles in Mark: the feeding of the 5,000 (Jews) and the feeding of the 4,000 (Gentiles). While the first feeding was for the "children," the second miracle in a Gentile region shows that even the "leftovers" or "crumbs" of Jesus' grace are enough to satisfy and sustain a massive crowd of "outsiders."

The key takeaway is that in God's "backwards, beautiful kingdom," we don't become insiders by being worthy or pushing others away. Instead, we become insiders because Jesus himself went "low," becoming an outsider on the cross for us. Jesus' grace, like the crumbs that satisfied the woman and the 4,000, is more than enough to make anyone, even those who feel like outsiders, a true insider and child of God.
