

At first, the project looks to qualify at Kids First, Level One refereeing (Up to U13) and then onto Level 2 (15 aside game).

We are hoping to have the project sponsored by Vic Young, Mitsubishi Motors to compliment the Schools Union funding.

The project will allow students to gain qualifications, supply them with referee kit and allow them to log their hours on the Young Rugby Ambassadors programme to accumulate giveaways for volunteer hours.
