


## Engage Activity - Population Counts and Habitat Assessments



## WINTER IN THE SCRUB

This is a cross-section of a gopher tortoise burrow during a Southwest Florida winter. While surface temperatures can drop to 50°F or lower, the temperature in the burrow rarely dips below 65°F. Many organisms depend upon these burrows during the winter months when the scrub can experience colder temperatures and occasionally fires. Below are some animals that live in the Florida scrub habitat. Briefly describe two ways you think each organism depends upon gopher tortoise burrows during the Southwest Florida winter.
