Topic / Concept - Addition Strategies

Goals; I will be using a variety of teaching strategies to help students learn addition strategies. I will be using the strategies from our math program but including ways to integrate technology into their learning of the strategies

The strategies I will focus on will be;

- 1. Counting on with a hundreds chart and number line
- 2. Doubles, doubles plus one
- 3. Draw a Picture
