



Dear Parent/Guardian,

Today at school, your child participated in a classroom presentation about the prevention of sexual and physical abuse of children. During this lesson, we talked about safe, unsafe, and unwanted touches and the importance of using the *Touching Rule: No one should touch your private body parts except to keep you healthy*, also known as the *Private Body Parts Rule* in grades 4-5. Private body parts were defined as the areas covered by a swimsuit. We also reviewed the *Ways to Stay Safe*, known as the “3 R’s”:

1. **RECOGNIZE:** Is it safe? Is it unwanted?
2. **REFUSE:** Say words that mean no.
3. **REPORT:** Tell a trusted adult.

Using a video for grades K-3 and a variety of scenarios in grades 4-5, students discussed and practiced recognizing, refusing, and reporting when someone has broken the *Touching Rule/Private Body Parts Rule*. All students K-5 identified many possible trusted adults to whom a child can report, including parents, babysitters, grandparents, teachers, adult friends, or neighbors.

Julie Stays Safe was initially designed for kindergarten. However, the CPS Elementary School Counseling Department felt this video would also be well-suited for first grade. David Speaks Up, the video referenced in the first-grade curriculum, is used for grades 2 and 3.

It is important to continue talking with your child about unsafe or unwanted situations and how to handle them. These can feel like difficult conversations to have.
