Course Descriptions

• 9-10 (Grades 5-12) Tuesday: Graphic Novel Study

Join Mr. Hogan to read and talk about a grade level appropriate graphic novel. Title TBA.

• 9-10 (Grades 5-8) Tuesday: Ag in the Classroom

This class provides students with an engaging exploration of agriculture and its critical role in our daily lives.

• 10-11 (Grades 3-4) Tuesday: Mystery Science:

A hands-on science class, students explore real-world mysteries using critical thinking and investigation. Each lesson begins with a big question—like "Why do stars twinkle?" or "What makes bridges so strong?"—and leads students through interactive videos, discussions, and fun experiments.

• 10-11 (Grades 4-12) Tuesday: Fly Tying

Dive into the fun and creative world of fly tying! In this hands-on class, students will learn how to design and tie their own fishing flies using colorful feathers, thread, and other cool materials. We'll explore different fly patterns, learn about the insects fish love to eat, and discover how to use simple tools to make flies that really catch fish. No experience needed—just curiosity and a love of nature! All materials are provided, and students will take home the flies they create.

• 11-12 (Grades 5-12) Tuesday: Theater/Drama

In this fun and creative elective, students will explore the basics of acting, improvisation, and stage performance. Through games, skits, and scenes, students will build confidence, learn to express themselves, and work together to bring stories to life. No experience needed—just imagination and a willingness to try something new!
