## **Apply the Institutional Effectiveness (IE) Rubric**

As part of the Mission Fulfillment and Institutional Effectiveness Report, which is nearly complete, we assess Lane’s institutional effectiveness by using the [Institutional Effectiveness Rubric](#). The rubric was developed by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities, our institutional accreditor. The rubric is focused on Standard 1.B.1-1.B.4. Institutional maturity is rated using criteria of Initial, Merging, Developed, or Highly Developed.



**Portfolio Review Subcommittee**

In 2022, the administration asked the IEC to create recommendations for an institutional portfolio review criteria, process, and body to administer the process. The Portfolio Review Subcommittee was formed at that time and has worked for the last year to develop the final [recommendations](#). **IEC members expressed deep gratitude to all of the [Subcommittee members](#) who completed this work – thank you!**

We discussed some of the finer points and provided clarification to those less familiar with the work. It was affirmed that the criteria, weighting of the criteria, and process will be subjected to another round of stakeholder feedback before being implemented. Sue, Colm, and Shelley, the IEC executive sponsors, can help ensure that additional feedback opportunities will be provided in the future.

Subcommittee members were asked to vote on whether or not they agree that the final recommendations should be forwarded to administration. Twelve members voted (the IEC Chair cast three proxy votes at the request of those members). Eleven voted “yes” and 1 abstained from voting. Members demonstrated overwhelming support to move forward the recommendations, as shown below.



**MFIE (Mission Fulfillment & Institutional Effectiveness) Report Writing Subcommittee**


