

## Ways to spend your funding by June 30:

- College visits and pay for transportation, lunch, etc.
- Summer program with a related field trip
- Manners classes and trip to restaurant to practice what they learned
- Weekly health/fitness camps with trips to fitness center
- Trips to museum related to learning or writing assignments
- Trips to zoo with learning or writing assignments
- Space Camp
- Hire teachers for summer camps (different themes each week)
- Transportation to summer camps
- Provide or increase the number of scholarships to summer camps (4H, sports etc.)
- Field trip to Break out Games (team building) This could be a family field trip.
- Researched based curricula (Too Good for Drugs, Too Good for Violence

- Swimming lessons scholarships
- Partner with summer feeding to provide educational and fun activity on opening feeding program day to increase participation (literacy activity and something fun like bouncy house, book give away, summer activity packets...)
- YSCs hire teens to work at elementary summer camps (with application and interview process)
- Buy books and take to low-income housing areas (apartments, mobile home parks, etc.) for story time and book give-out.
- Summer clubs/camps for middle/high: Pay professional to teach photography, guitar lessons, art lessons, song-writing, tennis, horseback riding, dance, drama
- Purchase learning materials and craft supplies and take to homes with children entering kindergarten next August
- Pay for teacher to provide a parent and child 'get ready for kindergarten' camp over several weeks during the summer
- Purchase the "Girls on the Run" program/curriculum to implement starting in August
- Pay for teacher to provide computer classes to parents over the summer with corresponding program for their kids
- Pay for a born learning picnic with parents/ children that came to your sessions and follow-up with them ( provide materials about child development, etc.)
- Do a summer feeding program in students' neighborhood. Have police officers and/ or CPS workers, attend your summer feeding programs so the students can get to know them...

- Do a Kindergarten readiness/ and or literacy night with students that have enrolled in kindergarten ( preschool or head start students as well)
- Purchase books if you do social skill groups that you can read to students about (anxiety, divorce incarceration) etc. Buy evidenced based curriculum if you have groups in your program plan.
- Pay for field trips with transitioning students to learn more about their new school (Hire teachers pay for transportation and food)
- Do a thematic workshop at your school or summer reading location and then do a field trip - pay for buses and teachers.
- Hire teachers to do a Math Night or Science Night/Stem (can be done virtually)
- Hire experts to come to your school to speak to parents during PTA/PTO meetings
- Have a FAFSA Night- provide dinner and door prizes
- Pay for a nutrition night where parents and students make healthy snacks- teach students and parents how to read nutrition labels- (make a healthy pizza, Kale chips, etc.) hire cafeteria folks and teachers or school staff to help (can be done virtually)
- Attend FRYSC approved trainings that will assist you with your job
- Pay for Yoga experts to come in and teach students and/or teachers, staff, admin on how to use Yoga for stress, tie this to testing
