REMEMBER! The <u>CCC</u> is closed <u>November 24-26 for the</u> <u>Thanksgiving Holiday</u>. PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY when it comes to meeting deadlines and meeting with the CCC staff.

The Common App and UC and CSU applications are available online now. Both are due Nov. 30th.

For those of you who are applying Early Action or Early Decision to colleges, you have a few more days to submit your applications. If you have SAT or ACT scores, send them ASAP to each college. If you are applying to a college that is located in a different time zone, be sure to submit your app before that time (e.g. submit a NYU app by 9:00 pm latest – not midnight - because New York is 3 hours ahead).

Be sure to pace yourself accordingly, be productive, get enough sleep and exercise to reduce the stress. Know that Ms. Cifuentes and Mr. Slavin are here to support you in any way.

Inputting grades on the UC & CSU Apps.

Some of you may have entered your grades from your Junior year using a Quarter system as those were the directions we previously shared. This works but requires some extra steps to show that you have fulfilled your A-G requirements. If you have any doubts or confusion about any of this information, please contact Ms. Cifuentes (scgudiel@srcs.org) or Matt Slavin (mslavin@srcs.org) from CCC before you submit your application!

This presentation outlines two other methods that are cleaner and easier to do.

Testing Reminders



The ACT and SAT are still optional for many colleges for 2022 admissions due to Covid-19, noted in an Inside Higher Ed article seen here, but be aware that many other students nationwide will be taking the tests and submitting scores. If

you are applying to a competitive college or major, it may be advantageous for you to take and submit your scores. You may have to travel farther than Marin to an available test center. **The staff in the CCC recommends that all students take either test** if it is at all possible unless you are only applying to CSUs. The CSUs will <u>not</u> consider SAT or ACT at all in their admissions decisions this fall.

Recommendation Requests on the Common App



Many students have asked where on the Common App they can find the recommendations requests to send to counselors and teachers. Below we have outlined some commonly asked questions about the common app that might make it easier to navigate!

- Under the "Common App" tab, you must fill out the first few "pages" in the Education section.
- Then, enter at least 1 college under the "College Search" tab, which then will appear under the "My Colleges" tab.
- Under the "My Colleges" tab, click on the name of 1 college. Under
 "Recommenders and FERPA", first select the box that says you'll waive your
 FERPA rights (very important this means that you will not see your
 recommenders' letters, which gives the recommender privacy this is what
 colleges want).
- Continue on to the next screen which asks for your counselor's name and email.
 Click on a box that indicates that the counselor will be contacted directly by the Common App.
- This process should be done for each teacher that will be a recommender, too.
 For many colleges, students can choose an "Other Recommender" who is NOT a teacher, but a coach, employer, supervisor, clergy, etc. We highly recommend this option to students.

California Colleges

We are excited to announce that San Rafael City Schools is partnering with California Colleges, which acts as a one-stop resource to help students discover their college and career goals and make plans for how to achieve them. Once rollout of the platform is complete, students will be able to launch their community college, CSU and UC college applications and also their financial aid (FAFSA and Dream Act) applications directly from their California Colleges accounts.

College and Career Center staff and SR Counselors will be sharing more information with students about how they can utilize California Colleges to support their post-secondary planning as the year proceeds. We will also be sending a letter sharing information about how families can access California Colleges resources.




