Students will be given prior notice of assessment dates in our House Newsletter. In order to further the learning process MIS will allow a retest of majors in which a student scores less than an 85. For majors, a reteach date and a retest date will be given out with the return of the original test. The retest will be scored and the student will receive the higher of the two grades, up to an 85. For minors, students can make corrections and provide a written explanation of their mistakes. Students will receive half the points back for each corrected answer and explanation.
