

Pocket Thoughts

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Supplies:

- **Stamp Sets:** Pocket Thoughts (163547)
- **Card Stock and Paper:** Basic White Card Stock (159276); Pretty In Pink Card Stock (163793); Unbounded Beauty Designer Series Paper (163372)
- **Stamp Pads:** Memento Tuxedo Black (132708); Pretty in Pink Ink (163807)
- **Tools:** Pocket Thoughts Dies (163552); 2" Circle Punch (133782); Heartfelt Hexagon Punch (162888)
- **Miscellaneous:** Iridescent Foil Gems (162842); Wink of Stella (141897); Pretty in Pink Stampin' Blends Combo Pack (163824); Pecan Pie Stampin' Blends Combo Pack (161674); White Frayed Grosgrain Ribbon (164205); Tear & Tape Adhesive (154031); Stampin' Dimensionals (104430); Stampin' Seal Adhesive (152813); Stapler



Measurements:

- Pretty in Pink Card Stock: 4 ¼" x 5 ½" and scrap for punch
- Basic White Card Stock: 4 ¼" x 5 ½" to die cut largest pocket die; 3 ½" x 4 ¼" for pocket insert and scraps for punch and to stamp cupcake on.
- Unbounded Beauty Designer Series Paper: 3 ½" x 4 ¾"
- White Frayed Grosgrain Ribbon: 2 ½"

Instructions:

1. Die cut the largest pocket die from the largest piece of Basic White Card Stock; fold back flaps and adhere with Tear & Tape Adhesive to the Pretty in Pink base.
2. Place the Designer Series Paper into the largest pocket die so that the ½ circle piece will be cut out of the top and die cut. Adhere this to the front of the pocket.
3. Stamp "Happy Birthday" with Pretty In Pink ink on the Basic White insert. Color the ribbon with the dark Pretty in Pink Stampin' Blend. Fold in half and staple to the top of the insert.
4. Punch the circle out of scrap of Basic White Card Stock; and the Hexagon out of a scrap of Pretty in Pink Card Stock.

5. Stamp the cupcake with Memento Tuxedo Black ink onto a scrap of white. Color with the blends and fussy cut. Adhere it to the circle and adhere this to the hexagon as shown. Pop all up on the front of the card with Stampin' Dimensionals. Add Wink of Stella to the cupcake frosting.
6. Add three Iridescent Foil Gems as shown.
