The introduction is written in paragraph form and contains the background, theoretical basis, and research objectives. The citation format in the manuscript and bibliography display follows the American Psychological Association 7th Edition. Reference writing must use the Mendeley application.

METHODS

Methods contain systematic and detailed explanations of methods or steps. The method does not contain theory, but rather emphasizes what the researcher has done to get the results as intended. The method must contain: type and design of research; time and place of research: research variables: research sampling techniques; instruments; collection techniques and sources; how to analyze and if quantitative, mention the statistical test. Research involvina experimental animals / humans, must have ethical clearance as evidenced by including the

register number of the research ethics commission that issued the ethical clearance.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Results and discussion are written in paragraph form (without subchapters) and contain research results to answer research objectives. The discussion answers why the results are so and is accompanied by appropriate reference evidence. The citation format in the manuscript and bibliography display follows the American Psychological Association 7th Edition format. Writing references must use the Mendeley application. Results and discussion are written without sub-chapter numbering.

The maximum number of tables and/or figures in the article is 6. The tables and figures must be written in the article. The order of writing should be the explanation of the table or figure (first), followed by the figure and table below it. The description of the figure/graphic is placed below the figure/graphic, while the title of the table is placed above it. The title begins with a capital letter. Spacing is 1 pt in

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both the table and the caption of the figure or table. An example can be seen in the following figure.




Figure 1. Covid 19 patients at X hospital
