Page 62, 10.1 PEN SITUATION A: (10-1 ut)

Page 67, 12-8 MISCONDUCT PENALTIES 3b: If a goal is scored,...with the opposing center 4 meters away at a 45 degree angle.

**Page 78, COMMENTS ON THE 2022 RULES CHANGES:** 2-6-1b, c, NOTE (NEW): In an effort to align..., a molded and <u>non-rigid</u> helmet eye shield...

## **2022 SITUATIONS:**

**SITUATION 1:** The Blue team is awarded possession on a boundary following a missed pass by the Red team. A Blue player runs off the field, picks up the ball and calls a possession time-out. Following the time-out, a different Blue player commences play on the official's whistle from the spot on the field relative to where the ball went out of bounds.

**RULING:** Correct procedure.

**COMMENT:** Play will commence on the official's whistle after a possession time-out. Any Blue player may take the boundary ball and shall resume play on the field within 2 meters of a boundary line. All others must be a minimum of 2 meters from the player with the ball. (4-3-3a, 6-3-1)

**SITUATION 2:** A Blue player is whistled for an empty stick check at midfield on Red No. 5. The Red team calls a possession time-out. Following the team time-out, Red No. 9 replaces Red No. 5 on the field.

**RULING:** Illegal procedure.

**COMMENT:** Any player may substitute following a team time-out, except for the player awarded the ball and the offender. (4-3-3; 9-1 PENALTIES for Violation of 9-1-1a, b and e-r)

**SITUATION 3:** During play, Red player No. 2 runs to the sideline to exchange a crosse. As No. 2 approaches the sideline, a Red coach enters the substitution area with a crosse. The Red coach, positioned in the substitution area, reaches out and exchanges crosses with player No. 2 running on the field by the substitution area.

RULING: Legal.

**COMMENT:** A player or coach is allowed to enter the substitution area to exchange a crosse when a player on the field is in the act of running to the substitution area. The crosse must enter and exit the field through the substitution area. The player exchanging a crosse may, but is not required, enter the substitution area to exchange the crosse. (4-7-5b, 9-1h)

**SITUATION 4:** The Red goalkeeper reaches out to bring the ball back into the goal circle with one foot completely out of the circle and one foot in the air above – but within the plane of – the goal circle.

**RULING:** Legal procedure.

**COMMENT:** The goalkeeper may reach out and bring a ball back into the goal circle provided a foot is inside (breaking the plane) of the goal circle. (7-1-2e, 7-2-1d)
