

Niebuhr: Time Is On My Side

This supply list is a suggestion of things to bring if you must work with your own supplies, mediums or tools or want to avoid waiting or sharing stuff. I do pledge that you can walk into this assemblage class and go home with a work of art just using the supplies I provide.

Student Supply List:

- Clock Bodies: I will have at least one clock body for every participant and probably more. Feel free to bring any clock, watch or time keeper as your central focus including anything with an empty space that needs to be filled. Some examples are banjo clocks, mantle clocks, alarm clocks and even pocket watches. Virtually any time keeper can make a mysterious story come to life as other objects, images or text are used to fill the voids.
- Substrates: I will have a selection of things that can work as a substrate. Feel free to bring some things from home that will act as a substrate for your projects. We can build a project from a cradled board or any other traditional art substrate. For the purpose of assemblage, think about mounting your project on a found object that relates to the meaning of time.
- Found objects: Bring anything you can think of that relates to the idea of time or just your "cannot leave at home" finds. Examples might be found small objects, game pieces, jewelry, beads, You can have your own items but Gary will have some objects to select from and Crazy Frank's Flea Market is only minutes away from the studio.

Tools

- Bring any of your tools you feel are necessary. A vast array of tools will be available in the workshop.
- Mixed Media Materials: Bring any of your mediums,
- Glues,
- Paints
- paint brushes
- mark making tools you feel are necessary
- Basic medium needs are going to include a matte medium, a gel medium, and Gesso.
- Art Making 101: Bring anything you cannot live without at home.
