What is the Torrance Test of Creative Thinking?

Your child has recently taken the Torrance Test of Creative Thinking (TTCT) as part of the Gifted and Talented identification process. This picture-based assessment measures five mental characteristics of one’s thinking: fluency, originality, elaboration, abstractness of titles, and resistance to premature closure. Creative strengths such as emotional expressiveness, movement or action, humor, richness of imagery, breaking boundaries, and elements of fantasy are also scored in a checklist. The test scores are percentile rankings, so for the age group an “average” score would be 50 (50th percentile). Scores above 50 would be considered above average for that area.

What are the results?
