SOPHOMORES: Sophomores have the opportunity of taking the PSATs (Pre-SATs) in October. One of the reasons for your student to begin practicing taking a college entrance exam is to prepare and practice so they score higher on their actual SATs or ACTs which may put them into scholarship range at the college/university of your choice. It also enters your student in the National Merit Scholarship Program which gives high scoring students full ride scholarships to universities around the United States. This test will also enter them into a scholarship database which will open up scholarships around the nation for you to apply for. The cost of the PSAT is \$18 payable the day of the test.

Student Dress: Student dress is expected to meet the following requirements: Cleanliness, Decency, Safety. These simple regulations are needed in order to provide a good, safe, and healthful learning atmosphere. Students are prohibited from wearing clothing advertising or promoting items illegal for use by minors including, but not limited to, alcohol or tobacco and wearing clothing displaying obscenity, profanity, vulgarity, racial or sexual remarks, making reference to prohibited conduct or similar displays. Inappropriate attire includes halter tops, spaghetti strap tops, and tube tops and hats. Shirts/tops should not have the sleeves cut out and need to cover the waist of the pants, skirts, or shorts being worn. Shorts must have at least a 4" inseam. No hats, hoods or stocking hats to be worn in school from 8:15-3:20. Exceptions to this rule will be during homecoming week or red ribbon week.
