### **Recruiting update**

I have two additional candidates currently going through the take-home exercise. Looking to get their responses early next week.

I had 7 phone screens this week. Only 2 are being sent to a phone screen with recruiting.

### **Notable product updates**

**Artifactory** -- We are preparing for an update to Artifactory next weekend. The unstable version is working great.

Base AMI -- No updates.

**Jenkins** -- We are running through all the Jenkins masters doing rolling LTS updates. Should be complete next week.

**Nebula** -- The Nebula dev squad pushed a new release of Nebula (v3.14), which includes bug fixes and updates to resolution rules.

Stash -- No updates.

#### **Meeting and context**

I had my **one on one with Jennifer Walters** from CHICKEN to discuss getting some updates into the next release of the Base AMI. The CHICKEN team is hoping to have this update included in the Base AMI before the end of October. The team doesn't see any issue with that.

I scheduled an *ad hoc one on one with Bruce Banner* from the COW team. I wanted to share with him feedback about his behavior in a recent meeting. I am sharing this with you all since a few of you expressed concerns about him coming off as inconsiderate of our team's priorities. He appreciated me bringing this up to him. I recommend that each continue to give him (and others) direct and honest feedback.

I had a great **one on one with Steve Rogers** from the CAT product team. Steve shared with me some of his team's challenges using Gradle, in particular around dependencies. They have a few unique goals, but in general, I feel our planned initiatives in this space will help them out. I shared our roadmap and he seemed pleased.

I attended the *Biweekly Engineering Managers* meeting. A few teams gave presentations on their upcoming initiatives, including the DOG team. They are building a product feature that will need some additional support from centralized teams, like ours. I set up a one on one with their manager to get greater insight into their priorities and roadmap.
