Chantry Middle School Coronavirus Health and Safety Risk Assessment

Summary of changes 7th February 2022:

• Government announcement on 19/01/2021 indicates that face coverings are no longer required in secondary communal classrooms as of 20/01/2022. Face coverings in secondary communal areas continue to be advised until 27/01/2022. We implemented this advice from Monday 7th February as our student numbers isolating had dropped significantly.

In line with Schools Covid-19 Operational Guidance updated 29th November 2021, we are planning for all pupils to remain in school with enhanced restrictions due to rising numbers of positive cases. NCC sent the following letter to Parents / Carers on 22nd October 2021 as guidance to follow. However the guidance does ask that schools 'make sure your outbreak management plans cover the possibility that in some local areas it may become necessary to reintroduce 'bubbles' for a temporary period, to reduce mixing between groups'. The school has outlined what form this would take in the Chantry Contingency (Outbreak) Management Plan. SLT will ensure compliance with NHS test, track and trace systems and that communication with PHE is effective.

The risk assessment has been developed alongside the <u>Trust Risk Assessment</u>, <u>HSE guidance</u> and <u>DfE guidance</u>. The risk assessment should be read alongside the school plan which is here.

	Classroom & Assembly arrangements	 Government announcement on 19/01/2021 indicates that face coverings are no longer required in secondary communal classrooms as of 20/01/2022. Face coverings in secondary communal areas continue to be advised until 27/01/2022. All windows and doors are to be kept open where possible to aid ventilation - please note that external doors may be used for ventilation as long as they are not fire doors and where it is safe to do so. In any cases where areas of poor ventilation have been identified and this cannot be resolved through opening windows and doors or minor repair works, the school considers the use of air cleaning units as an additional mitigation. Windows to be opened in all classrooms to allow ventilation. In cooler weather windows should be opened just wide enough to provide constant background ventilation. If an individual is in a room alone the window can be closed. Rooms without ventilation should not be in use by groups. Good hand hygiene should be regular practice for all students/staff/visitors. Hand washing facilities are available, hand sanitisers are also available on entry/exit to all rooms throughout the school. The school will continue to promote good respiratory hygiene - 'catch it; bin it; kill it" - there will be lidded bins in every room for tissue disposal. Wipes or roll/disinfectant spray are to continue to be used in ICT suits on computers. Disinfectant spray only to be used if it can be kept in a safe lockable location before and after use. Students must sit in the same place at all times. Desks and chairs must not be moved from their location. Hand sanitiser available in every classroom. Staff will run through these expectations with every new group and regularly reinforce them Documents will, where possible, be shared online and paper copies kept to a minimum. Use of removal / isolation from school as required Teaching or supervising staff to identify any concerns over student anxiety and stress, and refer to pastoral/SLT Behaviour Policy now has a Covid-19 related section about dealing with specific poor behaviour, e.g. intentionally spitting or coughing at another person School attendance is mandatory for all pupils of compulsory school age. Where a student is required to self-isolate or quarantine because of Covid-19 in accordance with relevant legislation or guidance published by PHE or the DHSC they should be recorded as code X.

• Visitors only in the school if essential including parents and need to be pre booked • Wherever possible, visits will be scheduled for after school Hand sanitiser used on entry to the building • Plastic screens now in place at the main reception Visitors • Reception staff or visit coordinator will induct visitors into school covid safe systems Any contractors or suppliers will provide a risk assessment for their visit for approval in advance Staff or • Asymptomatic testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection. Asymptomatic testing is taking place for staff and students in students in Years 7 and 8, all NHS and government guidance is being followed. Guidance on confirmatory PCR tests is also being followed. From school with January 11 people who receive positive lateral flow device (LFD) test results for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be required to self-isolate symptoms immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test. Home testing Risk assessment • Students/staff/visitors should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on Covid-19 (for example, they are required to guarantine). Any student that shows signs of Covid-19 is to be immediately reported; they will be isolated in a ventilated space and parents contacted so they can be removed from the site. They should avoid using public transport and PPE should be worn if close contact is necessary. • Staff are to be isolated should they show any symptoms however they will leave the site asap. Dealing with a positive case and close contacts • Any staff member or student with a confirmed case of COVID-19 must not attend the school setting and isolate as per government and NHS auidance. • From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. • The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace. • If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation. • If staff/students are identified as a close contact they will be identified via NHS Test and Trace. NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case to identify close contacts. Contacts will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. • From 30th November 2021 all individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will be contacted directly and required to self-isolate immediately and asked to book a PCR test. They will be informed by the local health protection team or NHS Test and Trace if they fall into this category and provided details about self-isolation. • People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time. • Any close contacts that develop symptoms should arrange for a PCR test without delay. This is so that any subsequent positive cases can be quickly picked up and for self isolation to begin as soon as possible. Remind parents/staff/students of policy - provide regular updates. Information on letters sent home to parents, staff briefings and student communications.

		• If a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending school, a decision will be made to refuse the pupil if it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with Covid-19. The decision would be carefully considered in light of all the circumstances and current public health advice.
	Heating	 When the heating is on and a room is occupied by a group, ensure at least one window is open to allow ventilation (high level if possible, more than one window in larger spaces such as halls). Convector heaters can only be used if the room can be well ventilated as identified above. If this cannot be implemented then the use of convector heaters will not be possible due to concerns that the air movement may spread airborne viral particles throughout the room (as per CIBSE COVID-19 Ventilation Guidance, May 2020). If an individual is in a room alone the window can be closed. When classrooms are not in use, windows to be opened to allow circulation of air and heating turned off, where possible.
Significant staff and student absence - illness (including mental health), self-isolation, shielding and childcare availability will impact staff and student attendance and may make the viability of running schools difficult	Staff capacity	 School and staff to follow government guidelines for hand and respiratory hygiene, and social distancing Asymptomatic testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection. Asymptomatic testing is taking place for staff and students, all NHS and government guidance is being followed. Systems have also been put into place following government guidance. Guidance on confirmatory PCR tests is also being followed. Staff with symptoms or who have a confirmed PCR test should follow public health england advice. They should not come into school if they have symptoms or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing Covid-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine). Staff will inform the Headteacher if they test positive via a PCR test and self isolate in line with government guidance. Clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV) people are advised, as a minimum, to follow the same guidance as everyone else. Additional precautions should be considered if necessary. All staff/students without appropriate ICT facilities at home have been provided with an appropriate device. This will help students continue with appropriate learning and allow staff access to working from home, if they are well enough to do so.

	Staff safety	 Adhere to DfE guidance on hand and respiratory hygiene. Where possible, continue to support learning using ICT creatively. Any staff member that shows any symptoms to inform the school and follow PHE advice; not attend and arrange a test. Staff to follow government guidelines for self isolation if a household member tests positive for Covid-19. Clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV) people are advised, as a minimum, to follow the same guidance as everyone else. Additional precautions should be considered if necessary and risk assessments reviewed/updated. As a minimum, frequently touched surfaces should be wiped down twice a day, and one of these should be at the beginning or the end of the working day. Cleaning should be more frequent depending on the number of people using the space. Wipes/disinfectant spray/roll will continue to be provided. Kitchen areas around school may be used by one staff member at a time. Please practice good hand hygiene. Staff will be required to bring in their own kitchenware and cutlery and keep this with them at all times, it should not be shared. It can be washed in the sinks in staff areas in school but should be kept somewhere secure when not in use. SLT continually leads by example around covid safe behaviours, there is also constant communication with staff and students to reinforce the messages.

On dedicated transport: It is recommended that children and young people aged 11 and over continue to wear a face covering when travelling to school It is no longer recommended maximising distancing and minimising mixing, but unnecessary risks such as overcrowding should be minimised Hand hygiene, respiratory hygiene and use of PPE should be followed in line with government guidance.
