PHS Summer Assignments

After careful consideration, Poolesville High School has decided to forgo summer assignments for students this year so that students' summer activities can be driven by their own (and their families') interests, needs, and goals rather than required coursework. It is our expectation that as a result of this "gift of time," students will return in the fall truly refreshed and ready to embrace the rigorous instruction that awaits them. We encourage students to continue learning over the summer by accessing great ideas through books and museums (digital options abound!), and by engaging in activities that elevate the body, the spirit, and the mind. August will be here soon, and having solid habits for stress relief and well-being are critical to your academic success. Any suggested enrichment activities or House-specific activities will be communicated in next week's message.

Summer Math: We strongly discourage taking an MCPS math class for original credit over the summer with the goal of accessing more advanced math courses in high school. In the brief weeks of summer school, students do not experience the depth of learning needed to succeed at the next level of advanced coursework. Any student who would like to have extra math practice can consider completing the **optional** <u>Summer Math Opportunities</u> offered through the MCPS math department.

Radon Testing Communication

Radon testing has been completed as part of the enhanced radon prevention program which began in 2016. The test results indicated that radon levels continue to be below the action level of 4.0 picocuries per liter of air (pCi/L), which is recommended by the U.S. Environmental protection Agency (EPA). **No mitigation is required at this time.** To access the radon testing results and additional radon information in 8 languages, please visit our website: <u>Radon Testing Results Page</u> and <u>Radon Information (8 Languages)</u>.
