Clydesdale - Blue Roan





Clydesdale horses are usually solid bay or black. However, Blue Roans can occur in this breed when the horse has a relatively even mixture of black and white hair that creates a blue appearance. This is a dominant genetic effect and true roans are said to be born roan or to shed out to that color when they lose their foal coats, rather than slowly progressing to it as with grays.
