#### IV. CA Dashboard Analysis

Mrs. Zylla shared the CA Dashboard data and the NWEA winter results. She discussed next steps in relation to the data (since the PAC meeting was not recorded, she recorded a narration of the presentation and the slide deck.

CA Dashboard results indicate that ELA and Suspension rates are satisfactory while Math and Chronic absenteeism are still areas of need.

#### V. NWEA Winter Results

Results indicate that positive progress is being made. Students are making good gains in mathematic but still not at grade level. Same is true for language. Mrs. Zylla explained that this is more than likely due to the fact that students are mastering standards/skills that are below grade level. With that said, the gains they are making are good and students are closing the gap. ELA scores show growth that is status quo much like the dashboard indicating that current instruction continues to meet the needs of those it met before, so innovation and differing strategies must be implemented.

#### VI. School Parent Involvement Policy Feedback

Mrs. Zylla shared the current School Parent Involvement Policy with changes that she will be suggesting for the 2024–25 school year. She asked for feedback or suggestions to take to Schoolsite Council. There were not suggestions or feedback.

## VII. Intent to Return Form

Mrs. Zylla reminded everyone to complete the Intent to return form as she needs the information to begin creating classes for next year. She indicated that there are many who have already filled it out and more inquiries for next year than have been in years past.

Mrs. Zylla explained that students can take classes and play on sports teams at the comprehensive even if enrolled at Las Flores.
