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Glossary

This glossary explains the labels and a few terms used throughout this document. These are working definitions meant to help a reader navigate the landscape, not exhaustive academic definitions.

Types of organisation

Cadre. A tightly organised group built around a committed core of activists ('cadres'), usually with a clear ideological line, internal discipline, and a strategy of building or leading a revolutionary party. Most of the groups in the Socialist, Communist and Anarchist section are cadre organisations.

Electoral. A group whose primary activity is standing candidates in elections, whether or not it expects to win. Distinct from cadre groups that treat elections mainly as propaganda.

Faction. An organised tendency operating inside a larger party (for example, inside the Labour Party or the Green Party) to shift its politics, rather than a standalone organisation.

Network. A looser, often horizontally organised group without the party-building goal of a cadre organisation. Networks tend to prioritise movements and campaigns over building a single party.

Coalition. An alliance of separate organisations and individuals cooperating around a shared aim (for example, anti-war or anti-austerity), usually while retaining their own separate identities.

Trade union. An organisation of workers formed to defend and advance their pay, conditions, and rights. This document notes carefully whether each union is affiliated to the Labour Party, affiliated to the TUC but not Labour, or independent of both.

Charity / NGO. A registered charity or non-governmental organisation providing services, research, or campaigning, usually non-partisan and bound by charity law. Charities in this document were added for educational purposes; they are not organised around a political tendency.

Campaign. A group organised around a single issue or demand (for example, ending the arms trade, or Palestinian solidarity), which may be time-limited or ongoing.

Political traditions

Anarchism. A tradition opposing the state and all coercive hierarchy, favouring directly democratic, non-hierarchical organisation. British anarchist groups here are mostly 'platformist' (favouring a degree of organisational coherence) or syndicalist (organising through workplaces).

Black liberation. A tradition centring the self-organisation and liberation of Black and racialised people, often anti-capitalist and anti-imperialist in analysis.

Bundism. A Jewish socialist tradition (from the Jewish Labour Bund) that stresses Jewish life and culture in the diaspora rather than in a Jewish state, and is historically anti-Zionist. In this document it applies to the Jewish Socialists' Group.

Eco-socialism. A tradition holding that the ecological crisis and capitalism are inseparable, so that a sustainable society requires the transformation of the economic system. The current closest to the Green Party's own left.

Hallamite. An informal label (from climate organiser Roger Hallam) for the strand of mass-participation, arrestable civil-disobedience climate organising associated with Extinction Rebellion, Just Stop Oil, and their offshoots.

Labourism. The broad tradition of seeking socialist or social-democratic change primarily through the Labour Party and the trade-union movement. 'Hard left' and 'soft left' are its two main internal poles.

Left Communism. A tradition to the left of Leninism that rejects both parliamentary politics and conventional trade-union work as dead ends, and is generally opposed to nationalism, including national-liberation movements. Very small in Britain.

Marxism-Leninism. The tradition descending from the Russian Revolution and the official Communist Parties, organised around a vanguard party. 'Anti-revisionist' variants (including Maoist and Hoxhaist ones) reject the later Soviet turn away from Stalin.

Orthodox Marxism. Marxist traditions that stress a return to Marx's own method, often critical of Leninist innovations such as the vanguard party. Includes the 'impossibilism' of the Socialist Party of Great Britain.

Trotskyism. The tradition following Leon Trotsky's opposition to Stalin, stressing permanent revolution, workers' democracy, and internationalism. It has fragmented into many sub-traditions, named here after key figures: Cliffite (Tony Cliff, the SWP), Grantite (Ted Grant), Mandelite (Ernest Mandel), Healyite (Gerry Healy), Spartacist, and others.

Feminism. In this document, the label is applied to groups organised primarily around women's liberation and gender justice. 'Abolitionist feminism' additionally links this to the abolition of police and prisons.

Strategies & associations

Front (or front group). An organisation set up or steered by a cadre group under a broad, appealing name, used to reach and recruit people who would not join the cadre group directly. The SWP's use of fronts is the most prominent British example. Naming a front is not to say its cause is illegitimate, only that one group is quietly steering it.

Entryism. The strategy of joining a larger party (usually Labour) to build influence or win members from within, rather than organising openly outside it. Militant's entry into Labour in the 1980s is the classic case.

International. A federation linking national organisations of the same tradition across countries (for example, the Fourth International, or the International Socialist Tendency). A group's international affiliation often tells you more about its politics than its national name.

Proscription. The legal banning of an organisation. In this document it applies specifically to Palestine Action, proscribed as a terrorist organisation under the Terrorism Act 2000; the legal status of that ban is covered in that group's entry.

Basebuilding. A strategy of patiently organising in workplaces and communities to build durable working-class organisation and power from the ground up, rather than focusing on elections or media.

Please note that the inclusion of a group or organisation in this document does not imply endorsement of its politics, methods, or positions. This is an educational resource intended to help Young Greens understand the landscape of the British left.

Political Parties

Left-of-Labour & socialist electoral parties

Your Party

Founded: 2025 **Type:** Electoral **Tradition:** Various (mainly Labourism, hard left)
Membership estimate: ~60,000 at launch (2025); many fewer since¹

Key facts

- The party associated with Jeremy Corbyn, following his removal from Labour, co-founded with Zarah Sultana in 2025 out of talks involving ex-Labour staff, the Peace and Justice Project, and independent left MPs.
- Launched to huge initial interest (around 800,000 people signed up for updates) but this only converted into roughly 55,000 paying members at first, partly due to bureaucratic infighting and a chaotic founding conference.

The most visible attempt at a new left-of-Labour party in years; useful to understand given how many activists YG will meet who are involved in or disillusioned with it.

Left Unity

Founded: 2013 **Type:** Electoral / Network **Tradition:** None in particular **Membership estimate:** No formal estimate; very few active members²

Key facts

- A previous attempt to build a left-of-Labour party, launched in 2013 following a public appeal by filmmaker Ken Loach.
- Several existing left groups affiliated at various points, including the Communist Party of Great Britain Provisional Central Committee.
- Activity dwindled sharply after 2015 as most of its base moved into Labour to support Corbyn's leadership; it has not fielded electoral candidates since.

Trade Unionist and Socialist Coalition (TUSC)

Founded: 2010 **Type:** Electoral coalition **Tradition:** Various (dominated in practice by the Socialist Party) **Membership estimate:** Coalition of organisations, not individual members; RMT disaffiliated in 2022³

Key facts

- Co-founded in 2010 by then RMT general secretary Bob Crow as an anti-austerity, anti-war electoral coalition.
- The Workers Party of Britain has held observer status on TUSC's steering committee since 2022.
- Very active heading into the May 2026 elections, positioning itself alongside discussions about consolidating Your Party into a more durable mass vehicle for socialist representation.

Socialist Party of Great Britain (SPGB)

Founded: 1904 **Type:** Cadre / Network **Tradition:** Orthodox Marxism (Impossibilism) **Membership estimate:** ~300 (2023)⁴

Key facts

- The oldest surviving Marxist organisation in Britain, formed in 1904 as a split from the Social Democratic Federation.

- Holds to 'impossibilism': it refuses to campaign for reforms under capitalism, arguing only for a direct transition to a stateless, moneyless, communist society once a democratic majority supports it.
- Anti-nationalist on principle: it has opposed Zionism since 1918, but frames this as part of a blanket rejection of all nationalism and all nation-states, so its position is neither Zionist nor pro-Palestinian. Not to be confused with the Socialist Party (SPEW), a separate group.
- Publishes the Socialist Standard and stands a small number of election candidates on this basis, more as propaganda than in expectation of winning.

Founded: 2019 **Type:** Electoral **Tradition:** None in particular **Membership estimate:** ~3,000 (2025)⁵

Key facts

- George Galloway's current party, formed in 2019 after Corbyn's Labour lost that year's general election.
- Socially conservative, with documented transphobia (it celebrated the 2025 Supreme Court ruling excluding trans women from some Equality Act protections), homophobia, and opposition to abortion, alongside support for small businesses and landlords.
- Explicitly pro-Palestine, and has adopted much of the old Communist Party's politics, including support for foreign Communist Parties such as China's.

Its social conservatism sits at odds with YG's own values; useful to be able to name this clearly rather than lump it in as generically 'left' because of its economic positions; some Green members have pushed for an electoral alliance, with few successes.

Labour left factions

Socialist Campaign Group

Founded: 1982 **Type:** Faction in the Labour Party **Tradition:** Labourism (hard left)
Membership estimate: Parliamentary caucus; membership fluctuates with each intake of MPs

Key facts

- The organised hard-left grouping of Labour MPs in Parliament, representing the parliamentary end of the Labour left.
- Jeremy Corbyn was its most prominent long-standing member before his removal from the party.
- Its influence has been sharply reduced under Keir Starmer's leadership, with several members losing the whip or leaving to join Your Party.

Momentum

Founded: 2015 **Type:** Faction in the Labour Party **Tradition:** Labourism (hard left)
Membership estimate: Not clear; likely still high on paper from lapsed Corbyn-era members, but largely inactive⁶

Key facts

- Formed in 2015 by a small number of activists after Corbyn's election as Labour leader, and became the main organisational home for Corbyn-supporting members.

Key facts

- A soft-left Labour faction positioned between the hard left and the party's centre, generally supportive of many socialist policies while prioritising electoral pragmatism.
- As with the soft left generally, this pragmatism has at times meant prioritising party management and electability over movement positions, including a slower and more cautious line on Gaza than the Labour left or the Greens; it does not hold a distinct pro-Israel institutional position of its own.
- One of the two organisations (alongside the think tank Compass) whose members founded Mainstream Labour in 2025.

- Represents the 'soft left' tendency inside the party, and works with Momentum on specific practical issues, mainly opposing the dominance of the Starmer-led right wing.

- The longer-established of the two organised left factions within the party, still active today.

- One of its concerns is ensuring the party does not drift rightward toward establishment politics as it grows.

- Has policy in favour of electoral reform, voting to oppose First Past the Post at its 2021 policy conference.

- Its 2023 Annual Delegates Meeting voted to support the introduction of proportional representation.

- Not a single organisation but a broad mobilisation involving XR, Black Lives Matter UK, Sisters Uncut, Gypsy, Roma and Traveller rights groups, and many others acting together.

Red Fightback

Founded: 2018; wound down around 2023 **Type:** Cadre (historical) **Tradition:** Marxism-Leninism

Key facts

- A small Marxist-Leninist organisation notable for combining a hardline communist programme with a strong emphasis on trans liberation and disability rights.
- Wound down in the early 2020s; included as a recent example of the more socially progressive end of the ML tradition.

A recent, now-defunct example of ML politics paired with trans and disability liberation, unusual for its tradition.

Master directories (statutory registers)

[Charity Commission for England and Wales](#). The statutory register of every registered charity in England and Wales, with each charity's registered purpose, finances, and trustees.

[TUC union directory](#). The Trades Union Congress listing of its affiliated unions, though note it does not include unions outside the TUC (for which see the Certification Officer register below).

[Certification Officer's register of trade unions](#). The statutory register of all trade unions in Great Britain, including those outside the TUC. More complete than the TUC listing for verifying whether a body is a legally recognised trade union.

[Electoral Commission register of political parties](#). The statutory register of all political parties registered to stand in elections in Great Britain, plus party finance and spending data. The place to verify whether an electoral group is a registered party.

[Companies House](#). Many campaign groups and solidarity campaigns are registered as companies (often companies limited by guarantee) rather than charities. Companies House is the way to check a given campaign's current legal status and filings.

[FCA Mutuals Public Register](#). The Financial Conduct Authority's statutory register of co-operatives and community benefit societies. Relevant for the housing co-ops, workers' co-ops, and some community projects that take this legal form rather than being charities or companies.

[National Union of Students \(NUS\)](#). The umbrella body for students' unions across the UK. Individual students' unions are also usually registered charities, so appear on the Charity Commission register too.

Far-right monitoring

[Hope Not Hate](#). A non-partisan organisation researching and monitoring the far right. The most accessible continuously-updated source on far-right groups.

[Institute of Race Relations \(IRR\)](#). An anti-racist think tank producing research and monitoring on racism, state racism, and the far right. A trusted source for deeper analysis alongside Hope Not Hate's monitoring.
