Assessment Information

- Reassessment Opportunities:
 - Missing work may be re-done and submitted up to 2 weeks after the activity is completed. After this time the grade will remain as is.
 - Any missed food labs will be marked as exempt
- Methods of Assessment:
 - Take Home Dishwashing Assignment: students will have 14 days at the start of the trimester to complete three loads of dishes by hand (wash, rinse, dry, put away, clean up any messes in kitchen)
 - The dishwashing assignment is a Safety and Sanitation requirement.
