Directions:

Your student will need a notebook or somewhere to collect notes to complete this assignment. For each **Choice Board** activity above, your child will be instructed to read, write and interpret texts using different strategies.

Step 1: Start each day at #5 on the Choice Board and select from one of the following 7 stories linked below:

Step 4: Repeat Steps 1, 2 and 3. Each time select a different strategy and different story to make your tic-tac-toe!
