Day 1 -

Class Discussion

Discuss writing stories.

What's the hardest part (writing the ending)

Show the video of Patrick thinking

Discuss the point that writing is hard, it means you need to think. We are going to practice the hardest part the ending.

Learners to explore the Pax the cat example

What's the point of this story? (the reader gets to pick)

Plan

Using the template learners to plan their outline, character, and setting.

Stop learners after each section.

Model a plan one for the learners to see and contribute to. Repeat process for the **outline**

Intro

Explain that this is the start of your story. No matter which pathway the reader takes they will always start here. For that reason it needs to be the BEST paragraph. Readers may want to read this story multiple times to explore the different endings, and therefore they will be reading this paragraph more than once!

Model how you might start a story like this using learner input, lead into the beginning of the story and the first decision.

Set timer for 12 minutes, learners work in silence.

Peer share

Oral feedback

5 minutes to recraft

Repeat for Paragraph 1

Choose one of the decisions

Model how it will need to lead into the next two decisions

Day 2

Repeat for paragraph 1A Write the first ending

Repeat for paragraph 1B Write the alternative ending

Day 3

Repeat for paragraph 2

Model how you will need to go back to the first alternate

Vocabulary	Reflection and Evaluation The writing experience was quite successful, however was very difficult for the learners. Writing endings to stories was hard, and therefore writing 4 of them was very tricky (even for my top writers). Some learners were not able to keep their story coherent and each decision was not necessarily separate. However for the most part learners really enjoyed this task. I think there would be value in exploring the successful stories as examples, and repeating this task with a bit more structure. Particularly around the structuring the genre of the learners stories. Or perhaps more structure around how to have 4 different endings.
