 Benchmarks Reading benchmark assessments will be given at the beginning and end of the year. Math benchmark assessments will be given mid-year and at the end of the year. Portfolio Method Student work samples will be collected throughout the year and reflect district academic expectations. Reading skills will be assessed using observation checklists, reading records, and one-on-one conferences. District math tests are given at the end of each unit and student progress is monitored using daily spiral math review. Science and Social Studies are integrated and assessed using observation, class projects, and participation.
