



What will my child be learning during the second nine weeks of school?

Foundational/Phonics

- Students will blend and segment phonemes (or sounds in a word).
- Students will decode and spell CVC words (such as cat, hid, cup).

Reading

- Students will identify story elements in fairy tales and folktales.
- Students will identify main characters in fictional texts, specifically fairy tales and folktales.

Writing

- Students will respond to fictional texts in pictorial and written formats.
- Students will write stories about themselves.



Questions to ask your child and things to talk about.

Foundational/Phonics

- What is the middle sound in the word 'hop'?
- Tell me the sounds you hear in the word 'miss'. m/i/s

Reading

- What was the problem in this story?
- Who were the main characters in this story?

Writing

- What event in your life did you write about?
- Draw a picture of what happens at the ending of your fairy tale.

Steps for Success

Read with and encourage nightly reading.

- Read aloud to model fluency and expression.
- Encourage nightly writing.
 - lists, homework assignments, journal entries, diaries, songs, poems, write to parent generated prompts
- Support knowledge of vocabulary skills currently being taught.
- Practice rhyming
- Read Open Court Decodable readers daily for fluency and decoding practice.
