Research Paper: Solving a Problem in Your Community

DIRECTIONS: For this assignment you will write a **3-4 page proposal argument** in which you will thoroughly explain **one problem** associated with a community (that you are a part of). You will propose **one clear and feasible solution** to this problem and try to convince your audience to implement your solution by explaining its benefits and responding to possible objections (**one counterargument**). You will target the audience of your choice (administration, teachers, local organization, etc. - think, *who will make this solution happen*?). To defend your argument you will also create a poster or video to accompany your project and will present during an informational fair on February 26th and 27th during conference.

SPECIFICS:

- The essay must use APA style, include a cover page, and include a references page with all research included in it.
- The essay must be three-four pages of written content (excluding the cover and references pages).
- The essay must include the following paragraphs: introduction that details the problem (can be two paragraphs), solution paragraph, counterargument and rebuttal paragraph, and conclusion paragraph (at least five paragraphs total).
- The essay must include at least three academic sources.
- All quotes must be followed by in-text citations, for example: (Bradbury, 1953, p.54).

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Outline and Explanation of Each Weekly Assignment

Week 1: Class Discussion & Determine Topic (Problem)

In class, we will break into groups and discuss possible problems in our communities. You will need to determine what problem you want to discuss for this project and finalize that topic by Friday, January 10th in class.

Week 2: Annotated Bibliography: Two sources on the problem.

Research solutions to solve your selected problem. Then, find two reputable sources on the problem (demonstration of research will take place during the block day of week 2 of the semester). For each source you found, create an annotated bibliography that includes the APA citation for the source and a 100-word paragraph that summarizes the article, notes its strengths and weaknesses, and indicates how it will be used to support your argument. Submit this in a single document to Turnitin.com.

Week 3: Annotated Bibliography: Select a solution and include one source on the selected solution.

Select a solution to your problem (you may need to research multiple). Using an academic search engine, find one source that has been peer reviewed. Create an annotated bibliography that includes the APA citation for the source and a 100 word paragraph that summarizes the article, notes its strengths and weaknesses, and indicates how it will be used to support your argument. Submit in a single document to Turnitin.com.

Week 4: First-Hand Research

Plan and conduct your own research into the issue. This can be done through survey (via a hand out or Google Forms) or observation (if you have an alternative, please talk to me). Submit the following to Turnitin.com: (1) your original survey (if you have one); (2) data/observations; (3) a 100-word paragraph that outlines your findings and how that will support your overall argument. Submit in a single document to Turnitin.com (if it isn't something that can be submitted to Turnitin.com, email it to me). Research Paper (Problem/Solution): First-Hand Research Paragraph due Feb. 1

Week 5: Annotated Bibliography: Find a counterargument and include a source that addresses that argument.

Research a counterargument that disagrees with your solution or proposes an alternative solution. Find a source that outlines this opposing argument. In a 100 word paragraph, outline the opposing argument and explain how your solution would work better than the opposing solution. Then, for the source, create an annotated bibliography that includes the APA citation for the source and a 100 word paragraph that summarizes the article, notes its strengths and weaknesses, and indicates how it will be used in your paper. Submit in a single document to Turnitin.com.

Week 6: Intro/Problem and Solution Paragraphs

Using the research you have gathered and the writing you have already submitted, merge your information and write a multi-paragraph introduction that describes the community and problem, alludes to your solution, and provides a thesis. Then, write a multi-paragraph section that focuses on the possible solutions, with their pros and cons, as well as your proposed solution. Support with evidence and reasoning, try to convince your reader that your solution is the best solution. Please include appropriate APA in-text citations for all quotes and paraphrases. Submit in a single document to Turnitin.com.

Week 7: Counter Argument and Conclusion Paragraphs; Advocacy Ad/PSA

Using the research you have gathered and the writing you have already submitted, merge/write a paragraph counter argument that addresses opposition, explain their position/alternative solution, and then outline why your solution is the best. Then, write a conclusion that emphasizes your overall goal and a call to action (what should your audience do now that they've read your paper). Submit in a single document to Turnitin.com.

Week 8: Infographic Poster or Video; Final Draft

Create an infographic poster or PSA video that communicates your problem, your solution, and next steps for your project. This should be submitted to me hard copy or via email and should be ready to present during
