Tasks

You do not have to cite according to any format other than indicating where it came from, such as "The textbook (p. 38) stated..." or "In my discussion response to student so-n-so...." or "In my news analysis in week 3....".
- 3. I value your insight and understanding. Please use your own words and learning. There is no word count that I am looking for; I am looking for your expanded learning and demonstration of the material. For some that is in fewer words than others. Note: each exam submission will be run through academic integrity software.
- 4. Save all of your short essay responses in one document (can be Google or Word or what works best for you), then upload in the assignment link (either a link to the Google document or the actual document.

- 6. How could you use sociology to fix a problem you see in the world?
- 7. What sociological theory do you resonate with the most or which one have you seen play out the most in your day to day routine?
- 8. How did your upbringing influence your political beliefs, religious affiliations, education/career decisions?
- 9. How does your idea about society and reality differ after this class?
- 10. Do you think there is a subsection in sociology that is most important, or are they all equally important?
- 11. Tell me three things you learned (examples and personal application required) from Chapter 9.
- 12. Create an essay test question from any chapter and answer the question. Please identify what chapter you are creating the question for.
- 13. Tell me three things you learned (examples and personal application required) from Chapter 10.
- 14. What concept/theory/idea was most impactful to you and how will you apply what you learned about that concept/theory/idea to your life?
