Class/Grade	Project
Pre-K	This grade will make cards and care packages for children at Mount Washington Children's Hospital. To prepare for this project, the teacher will read a book about doctors and nurses and their role at hospitals. The teacher will explain that when people get really sick, they sometimes need to stay in a hospital for a long time, and sometimes those people are children. The teacher will go on to explain that we will be creating care packages for sick children to give them things to do while they are in the hospital and to help them feel better.
K	Students will review what makes a community, how we can be good citizens, and who they can help. Each class will create mural on large paper that will depict their community in the city. Then, they will discuss how the mural relates to them being citizens in the community and discuss how they will collect supplies for the senior center.
1	This grade will be cooking healthy snacks for firefighters, writing thank you cards for the local firehouse on Eastern Avenue.
2	This grade will observe the effect of trash thrown into storm drains on the health of the Waterfront in Canton. Then, they will locate storm drains in the neighborhood and note those that need to be painted to encourage less dumping. Lastly, they will use this information in a letter to Councilman Kraft requesting help with more clearly marking the drains.
3	This grade will educate younger grades about recycling/being green by performing a reader's theatre, poll classes and create graphs on school-wide knowledge of recycling. In addition, they will learn about pollution and the Chesapeake Bay and what they can do to help.
4	This grade is partnering with Meals on Wheels and organizing a small food drive as well as creating placemats and cards.

5	The students will identify parts/sections of Patterson Park that need maintenance and/or improvements and are draft letters to Councilmen Kraft in hopes of getting these improvements made. They are focusing on maintaining and improving the resources of their community.
M.S.	Students will focus on the issue of bullying in schools, its effects on students, and how we can work together to stop this practice at all schools. Students will produce a variety of projects to bring attention to this issue.  Other students will discuss the importance of understanding tolerance and diversity on all levels as they prepare themselves for high school and the experience of being introduced to a brand new student population. Students will produce a variety of projects to bring attention to this issue.  An additional project is being planned.
