<b>1. New recruitment</b> <i>How many new participants, who were generally new to organizing altogether, did your work bring in? How many joined DSA?</i>	We had around 40 attendees at our committee meeting on 3/11, roughly half of them first time GNDC attendees and a third new to DSA. We also worked with MEC to add an Earth Day focused breakout at the last general meeting, which was so large that we had to split it into two groups. A good number of these folks joined our GNDC meeting on 3/11 as well. Unclear how many are official members.	We aim to gain 10 or more new committed members who consistently show up (virtually) to committee meetings, work sessions, and events.	We are planning an Earth Day mobilization (though maybe not a rally). We will be engaging and recruiting new members both via providing opportunities to get involved in the preparation for the mobilization (art builds, social media, etc), but also by engaging politically active members of the climate strike coalition.
<b>2. Leadership development</b> <i>How many less-involved members have been stepping up in your committee, and in what ways?</i>	The committee is still in its early stages and learning, but we've had some good successes. There is a subcommittee working on a formal strategy for inclusive growth and leadership development. We have smaller groups working on campaign strategies, which has been a good avenue for people to develop strategic thinking and political awareness. We have been rotating facilitator duties to non-chairs to help give returning members more responsibility (would like to discuss this).	We aim to get one or more campaigns officially in motion (exact number subject to vote), and we aim to have leadership of these campaigns composed of new committee members and new leaders. We also wish to have a leadership development plan that we can measure our progress against.	We have a formal document for reaching out to new folks and tracking our 1:1 conversations, and we have assigned responsibility to specific co-chairs to either follow up or delegate with each new member. We plan to use our campaigns to develop new leaders and give them real responsibility with support from the co-chairs. There are already people we have begun to identify as potential future co-chairs. We also plan to amend our committee rules with additional language about diversity and inclusivity.
<b>3. Achievements</b> <i>What material outcomes have you helped win (bills passed, workers on strike, contract</i>	We formed a committee! We also helped organize a GND-themed Bernie canvass in West Oakland that had about 100 attendees.	We aim to improve the internal culture of the committee to make meetings more productive and desirable to attend, especially if they are remote/online! We	Tbd pending campaign plans

<b>4. Political education</b> What political education efforts did you take on (assigned readings, discussions, etc.) and how many people participated?	This has not been a priority while we are forming the committee, though maybe we should have done more. One thing we have done is democratically decide the committee rules, and in that process we decided to ground our work in the principles of the GND already passed at the convention (all of which was political education).	We aim for members of our committee to have a good working understanding of the green new deal and why it is an important political program. For those who have a strong background in environmentalism but not labor, we wish to educate about the importance of labor organizing and of tactics successfully used by labor movements. For those who have a background in labor but not ecology, we wish to increase awareness of climate science and other ecological issues that impact the multiracial working class. We also wish to improve understanding of our energy systems and the various political arguments for how they must evolve.	The committee will be studying and discussing the official GND resolutions passed at the national convention, and other related Eric will be meeting with the Avir from the Political Education Committee to talk about plans. We are interested in discussing topics related to energy democracy and discussing various angles of green growth vs. degrowth as socialist visions. One particular idea that we have been discussing is a reading of A Planet to Win.
