A couple important things first:

Because it's caused some confusion for enough people, I should state here:

The request you make in the final week of the month is paid for on the upcoming first of whatever next month is around the corner. For requests made in the final week of January, for instance, you'll pay for it on the first of February and get it a week or so later.

Remember this as an order of **Request > Payment** (on the first) > **Reward!**

Please fill the name/handle you wish to be credited with into the Email's subject line! If you're in the Discord, put your username next to it. In the end, the subject should look like this:

J. McCommission-Man - jmccm - Golden Goose\Astral Albatross Request (Obviously, type in whatever tier you're commissioning in, not both. Most do that, but just to be sure, I'm sayin' it.)

Secondly, the guidelines, don't forget the guidelines.

- 1. Okay, first isn't not really a guideline, but feel free to send multiple different requests in one submission if you can't decide or want me to choose and surprise you. This isn't necessary, but is a bit of extra fun for me, having all the extra options.
- 2. Keep the descriptions short and succinct. I like to say "Describe what the jacket is, not why the jacket is", ya dig? Put a hold on dumping a gigaton of related lore about the character on me, you can gush all you want in the Discord, eh?
 Try to keep the total email to around 8 sentences, shooting for less. If it overflows a lot, take a step back and look at what reeeally needs to go in the description. Trim the quips, free up space, etc etc. All this is to make it easier for me to get you what you want.
- When sending these, don't be afraid to use bullet points. It makes it easier for me to read and some may find it easier to describe that way.
 Send me any associated visual references. I take 3D models, 2D turn arounds, any art of
 - the character, or even just pictures that look like what you have in mind (stuff pulled off pinterest or twitter or wherever)
 - I also accept reference images and requests delivered in the form of a google doc, if you're prone to changing your mind or forgetting a pic or two and might need to change something later.
 - Just make sure the refs you send are high resolution! I can't get details from a fuzzy or small image!

As always, be open to artistic interpretation! This is a "first-pass-and-send" system, things might not be how you imagine in your head, no matter how much description you try to send.

Now! The actual template! (Everything in between dashed borders, minus the parenthesis stuff)

If instead of describing your character with just words, you want to send images, you can. Make sure to upload them with that little paperclip icon, instead of posting hyperlinks or drag-and-dropping. This keeps them neat and tidy on my end and results in a less cumbersome email to navigate. I also accept Imgur links or Google Docs with the refs inside. If you could still also mention which part of your character each ref image relates to, that'd be super helpful. Sometimes I get two refs that contradict each other and I'm not sure which parts of which I'm supposed to take, yknow?

Things I won't do!

- Real people. Don't be sending me none of your family members please.
- Fringe-ier fetish stuff. If you have to ask, it's probably too far.
 - Transformation, vore, etc. etc.
- Warhammer 40k.
- Super complicated armor/mechs/weapons. Don't have time for that.
