Attendance Matters at OLR

As education is important for every child, regular attendance at school is essential for your child to make the most out of their learning time. In NSW, the Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure that their children attend school each day that the school is open for learning.

At OLR this year we are endeavouring to halve the amount of learning days lost to absenteeism in 2017 and we can only do this with the support of parents and carer. Please read the information in this link: <u>Compulsory School Attendance</u>.

Uniforms

It is great to see or students wearing their full school uniforms. We have added an all-weather jacket to our uniform list (please note that this comes without a logo as the stitching compromises the waterproofing), so that an extra layer may be added to keep your child warm if needed.

We have noticed that some students, particularly in the older grades are wearing rings and bracelets and nail polish which are not part of the school uniform as stated in the policy:

"Other inclusions and exclusions as listed below:

EARRINGS:- A maximum of 2 earrings per child i.e. one in each ear, are to be worn. Only a plain stud or small sleeper will be permitted (unless your child has just had their ears pierced, then they are permitted to wear the earrings put in for the specified time). We ask that you support the school policy and ask your child to remove these items before coming to school.

NECKLACES:- A Crucifix or religious type of necklace may be worn provided it is under the school uniform. NO shells, pearls, beads, trinkets, leather straps etc will be permitted. Wrist Watch:- A wrist watch may be worn.

NO other jewellery other than the articles specified above will be permitted at any time. NAIL POLISH:- NO nail polish of any colour or type will be permitted.

HAIR:- Any students, male or female, with hair over their face or eyes must have it clipped back by either a hair clip (in the school colour) or by tying it back. Hair of shoulder length or longer, both male and female, must be worn tied back. Clipper cuts must be not less than a number 2, with no graphics or words etched in to the cut.

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<u>HAIR ACCESSORIES</u>: Plain blue (in the school colour) ribbon, scrunchies and elastics will be permitted only. NO flowers, coloured hair accessories etc will be permitted. Ribbons and bows should be of a reasonable size, no Jojo bows or the like. Hair styles which restrict the effective wearing of the school hat will also not be permitted.

HAIR COLOUR: Hair colour should be natural."

Teachers will be sending home notes with students who are wearing accessories/incorrect uniform.
